VicRoads MAG


Motorcycle Advisory Group


3 MEET YOUR COMMITTEE

No club can exist without the volunteers who serve as Committee Members, the current LCoA Committee is as follows:




PRESIDENT

VICE PRESIDENT



SECRETARY



HUNDREDS OF VINTAGE SCOOTERS OUTGUN WARSHIPS... IN BEROWRA

Warships may have been the kings of Sydney over the long weekend but it was hundreds of vintage scooters that shone locally as the biggest collection to ever gather in NSW descended on Berowra and surrounding areas.

In scenes reminiscent of 1960 Brighton, England, more than 300 riders from every corner of Australia formed a cavalcade of vintage machines and headed to the local area, packing the Berowra Waters ferry en route, for Sydney's first Australian National Classic Scooter Rally.

Many of the Vespa and Lambretta riders rode thousands of kilometres to attend the all weekend event on machines that boast tiny 10-inch wheels (about the size of a family pizza) and 200cc engines.

Once amassed they became the largest contingent of vintage scooters (manufactured as back as far back as the 1950s) to ever gather in NSW.

Oliver Ashworth, Director of the Australian Classic Scooter Rally said, "Berowra and the surrounding areas has never seen a sight quite like that of hundreds of vintage scooters rumbling along in procession.

"Our cavalcade snaked its way north from the Rocks in Sydney in a procession that must have been about a kilometre long.

"Bemused locals waved and cheered as we buzzed past on our route that involved packing the Berowra Waters Ferry from front to back with machines and their riders.

"Local riders joined those who came as far afield as Melbourne, Perth, Vietnam, Dubai and the UK

"The event only takes place annually and rotates between different state capitals so it was quite a rare sight that the locals got to enjoy."

The Australian Classic Scooter Rally was a not for profit event hosted by a group of Sydney enthusiasts from the Ardly Normal Scooter Crew in collaboration with the Lambretta Club of Australia. <http://www.classicscooterally.com.au>

1000km, 40 RIDERS, 10 INCH WHEELS, 2 DAYS = 1 AWESOME TIME!

We always thought this ride was going to be eventful, and we weren't disappointed. 12 months in the making, and hatching plans behind the scenes came to fruition early on a Thursday morning in Windsor just outside Sydney.

After seeing footage of the Kiwis Mille posted on YouTube, a few of us put our heads together; in typical scooterist fashion, we made our own fun. We pinched some rules off the Yanks and set forth nutting out a track. What is a Mille you ask? It's a competitive road event without being a race where the advantage is to the older machines with a lower displacement. (find more at scootermille.weebly.com).

The first stretch was Putty Road, there is 170km between towns so most people had to carry extra fuel. Coming up to the 100km point my face started to hurt from giggling so much, this was a cracker of a road with loads of twisty bits. The dead wild life on the side of the road was a bit of a worry, a few of the riders had close encounters with kangaroos. It was a smug feeling riding past some of the tuned up machines filling up out of their jerry cans, before it was my turn, everyone leap frogging each other while they filled up by the side of the road. It was time for our first task for the day, to get a photo of your scooter outside the local Police station.



The next stage through the Bylong Valley was a bizarre stretch with the weather, first we past a bush fire burning, then it started to rain...hard, next it started to hail and some got sleet heading up into the mountains. This is where we left the main drag and went up the Great Dividing Range, it seemed that we just kept on going up and up for a couple of hours. The riders started to spread out now and seemed like we were riding by our selves (most of us were only a few minutes apart). Rolling into Rylestone, for our next task was to collect a beer coaster from the local pub. The leg into Bathurst was getting late in the day, with the sun dipping so did the temperature. Scooters kept on coming in for the next 2 hours, James Grygiel ended up calling it quits 50km from home as his poor excuse for a head light wouldn't light up the road 5 metres in front and was concerned about running in to wildlife or one of the local 4WDs that seem to fly around.



Day 2 started slowly as the previous nights festivities showed. Everyone was in good spirits, we headed to the starting line of the Bathurst race track, Mt Panorama. Most left town together, (some thought they'd take a short cut, but ended up getting lost), most people were happy to enjoy the sub-zero morning (till the hypothermia set in). I kept thinking to myself "we're still going up!" which meant it was going to get even colder.

Then the surface deteriorated riding into the valley that crosses the Abercrombie river, this was one of the highlights of this stretch, a steep decent on hair pined roads, across a one way rickety timber bridge, then up the other side. Rolling into Taralga there was a bunch of us looking for the first task for the day, photo of your scooter in front of the Catholic Church.

Heading out of town I pass 2 ambulances going in the other direction. My heart fell, thought at least their not being followed by a police car, that would mean a road accident. 2 minutes later a police car screams past. Oh shit! The wind has gone out of my sails, I take it easy coming into Goulburn and pull into the first servo. We catch up with other riders and are given the bad news that Lars has had a head on with a car. He's folded his Rally in half snapped one of his legs and badly damaged the other and has been air lifted to Canberra hospital. A few more scooters roll into the servo before we head off as a group. After lunch at Sutton forest, I decided I wasn't in the mood to play anymore and made a direct line back to Sydney through the Illawarra region. I felt guilty about this, it turns out most other people's thoughts were along the same lines after the accident.

About a dozen riders stayed the course went down Kangaroo Valley & did the last task, to collect a handful of beach sand (to make sure people went the coast road & not cut the corner & head to Sydney). In peak hour traffic we somehow arrived at the finish point under the Sydney harbour bridge. I stood dazed & confused re what went on over the last 2 days, & the 12 months of planning that lead up to it. Looking around, everyone had weary smiles & a sense they've achieved something...thrashing vintage mopeds around the back blocks of country Australia.

THE SA REPORT

THE VICTORIAN REPORT

In December Victorian Lambretta Club of Australia members took part in the Christmas Scooter & Motorcycle Toy Run organised by the Victorian Scooter Riders Association (VSRA) and the Independent Riders Group (IRG). This was the first Toy Run ever organised to specifically include Scooters as well as Motorcycles and LCoA members played a big part not only in participating, but also organising the event.

The Toy Run is an annual Christmas Fund Raiser for the Father Bob Maguire Foundation, which reaches out to Melbourne's needy, not only at Christmas, but all year round.

One of the Victorian LCoA Members owns the chain of "My Size" ladies clothing stores and arranged a store wide collection of Toys, Gifts and Food from customers and donated the use of a recently restored "Lambro" 175 to transport some of the donations to the Toy Run..

FIGHTING FOR THE RIGHTS OF SCOOTER RIDERS

The Victorian Scooter Riders Association (VSRA) is made up of members from four Clubs, the LCoA, The Vespa Club of Melbourne, the Melbourne Crusaders Scooter Club and the Melbourne Scooter Connection, early in 2014 a fifth Club, the Melbourne Scooter Group will join the organisation. The VSRA will therefore then represent around 1000 scooter riders with the purpose of being an advocacy Group lobbying for the rights of Scooter Riders in Victoria. In the last issue of the Pacemaker we published an article from the VSRA advising how many Crash Helmets sold in Australia may not meet the mandatory Australian safety standards, even though they have what appears to be the right sticker.

This report from the VSRA advises that they continue to lobby road safety authorities with the aim of seeing the introduction of Lane Filtering and the sharing of Bus Lanes by scooters and motorcycles in Victoria.



The VSRA are currently discussing Lane Filtering and Bus lane sharing with VicRoads, the Transport Accident Commission, Victoria Police, the Victorian Government Minister for Transport and the Minister for Transport, Planning and Local Infrastructure. Of particular concern is why the results of the recent trial allowing scooters and motorcycles to share the Hoddle Street Bus lane have not been released, this may months after the trial has been completed. Stay tuned for more info.....



RIDE SAFE WITH "THE PROF"

Firstly apologies for missing the previous addition of the Pacemaker. With the EuroLambretta & Sydney National Rallies things were quite hectic. Lord only knows how our editor manages his work load, considering he also attended these events. I congratulate several members who have obtained their "L" or full license. One who gained their full license was credited with doing one of the best emergency stops the examiner had ever seen. That candidate had recently undertaken the LCoA Road Safety Rider Training Initiative and when asked how they learnt how to do the manoeuvre credited the LCoA Initiative, thanks for that! We are in early 2014 providing some 1 on 1 training with riding virgins (scooter) with riders who have obtained their L's but feel they need more confidence before venturing out. So give the Ed a call should you like some extra tuition.

This month's rider tip is very simple but important one, prompted by an event whilst at EuroLambretta. The tip is about avoiding Hazard Fixation. I'm sure most of you can remember riding your bicycle as a child, coming near to the kerb & not being able to steer away from it!



This is because you focus on the kerb and not where you actually want to go. This is called Hazard Fixation.

In our environment it relates to seeing an object in the road you want to avoid and running into it. The tip is therefore to look where you want to go, which is anywhere but where the obstacle is. This maybe going into a bend and your heading for the curb, you've read the bend wrong. Ignore the kerb it's not going anywhere, look further round the bend and your scooter WILL trend towards where you are looking. It's simple! Look where you want to go.

Safe Riding and have a very merry Christmas and see you all in 2014.
